No quote marks around journal article title

Bowman Jr, J., 2015. *Strategies for mitigating supply chain disruptions* (Doctoral dissertation). Walden University.

In this style, the institution goes after the brackets for theses/dissertations.

'Vol.' and 'no.' not used in this style. Written as '50(3)'

Brandon-Jones, E., Squire, B., Autry, C. & Petersen, K., 2014. "A contingent resource-based perspective of supply chain resilience and robustness". *Journal of Supply Chain Management*, Vol. 50 No. (3 pp.) 55-73.

Full stop between article title and journal name (not comma)

Journal name should have been in Title Case

Braun, V. & Clarke, V., 2021. To saturate or not to saturate? Questioning data saturation as a useful concept for thematic analysis and sample-size rationales. *Qualitative Research in Sport, Exercise and Health*, 13(2), pp. 201-216.

Colons, not 'pp.' before page numbers.

First word after a colon capitalised in this style

Brown, M.E. & Dueñas, A.N., 2020. A medical science educator's guide to selecting a research paradigm: Building a basis for better research. *Medical Science Educator*, 30(1), pp. 545-553.

Brown, S. & Gama, M., 2018. House view. *Finweek*, 2018(22), pp. 14-14.

This style used the full word 'edition', not the abbreviation 'ed.', separated from the title with a full stop.

Bruwer, J.P., 2016. *The relationship(s) between the managerial conduct and the internal control activities of South African fast moving consumer goods SMMEs* (Doctoral dissertation). Cape Peninsula University of Technology.

Bryman, A. and Bell, E., 2011. *Business Research Methods*, 3rd edition. New York.

Commented [KW403]: Publisher?

Ampersand (&), not 'and' used in this style.

Buchanan, E.A., 2000. Ethics, qualitative research, and ethnography in virtual space. *Journal of Information Ethics*, 9(2), p. 82.

Burgos, D. & Ivanov, D., 2021. Food retail supply chain resilience and the COVID-19 pandemic: A digital twin-based impact analysis and improvement directions. *Transportation Research Part E: Logistics and Transportation Review*, 152, p. 102412.
